Croft, *Musica Sacra*, vol. 1 (London: John Walsh, 1724) p. 182

Only Ch.Ch. and Croft have an organ with bass figures. The work may be performed with or without accompaniment.

The work appears in Croft's *Burial Service*, where he makes a number of changes which are not found in the Purcellian sources. Notably, Croft gives equal notes for the dotted rhythms at the end of phrases.

13, Bass: Sources vary between the upper and lower octave for these notes.

17, Soprano: Some sources have the same rhythm as the other parts.

17, Bass: Sources vary between the upper and lower octave for both notes. The small notes are an editorial suggestion.

21: Only Ch.Ch. 794 has the pedal note in the vocal bass part. If performed unaccompanied, some fraction of the Basses could hold the D.

25, Tenor: Only Add. 31444 has two crotchets here. Other sources have a minim A.
