This is one of two settings of this text in the 1575 collection of sacred motets by Byrd and Tallis, *Cantiones sacrae*. Note values have been halved, and the music transposed up a tone. Small accidentals are used to show reduced or extended validity of source accidentals and *musica ficta*; bracketed accidentals are cautionary.
